Call for Abstracts (Oral Presentation) and Papers IDRiM 2026

Resilient Cities in Multi-Hazard Crises: Bridging Innovation, Implementation Science, and Grassroots Action

5-9 September 2026

Bali, Indonesia

The IDRiM 2026 Conference invites researchers, practitioners, policymakers, and stakeholders from around the world to submit abstracts for oral presentations. **At this stage, authors are required to submit only an abstract. Authors of accepted abstracts will receive specific guidelines for preparing their oral presentation (e.g., PowerPoint format, duration) at a later date.**

Full paper submission is optional and will be requested later only from those who wish to pursue publication opportunities. Selected submissions will have the opportunity to be considered for publication in SCOPUS-indexed journals, SCOPUS-indexed conference proceedings, and the IDRiM Journal.

All abstracts must be submitted through the official conference portal at www.idrim2026.com.

Special Opportunities for Young Scientists

Early-career researchers, scientists, and practitioners represent a distinct and valuable segment of academia and professional practice. They frequently bring forward innovative ideas and research that can either reinforce or constructively challenge current perspectives. Despite this, many young scientists often depart from academia within three years of completing their research programs. This rapid attrition means their deserving ideas and research often lose the opportunity for necessary exposure.

The Annual IDRiM conference features a Young Scientists Session (YSS) that invites young researchers, scientists, and practitioners to submit their innovative ideas and research for oral presentations to a wider audience. As IDRiM does every year, there will be a “Best Young Scientist Award” competition. The top three YSS awardees from IDRiM 2026 will be invited to deliver a full academic-style presentation to a specially arranged session in 2027.



Eligibility Requirements:

- Qualifications to be a Young Scientist are not determined by age or position.
- Presenters at past YSS events have primarily been:
 - Graduate students (including Master's).
 - PhD candidates.
 - Researchers who received their PhD within the past four years.
 - Practitioners who have started working in the disaster risk management field within the last four years.
 - Researchers making their debut in an international academic discussion.
- These time limits do not include periods of absence due to illness, family illness, or maternity leave.
- Individuals who pursued a PhD later in life, after a significant career in the field, may not automatically qualify. Eligibility will be considered on a case-by-case basis by the YSS committee.
